Dulcimer Facts: Traditional dulcimers were designed using the diatonic scale, the white keys on the piano. You could not play a sharp or flat by mistake because there were none. The more modern dulcimers have extra frets such as the 1 ½, 6 ½, 8 ½, or 13 ½ frets. This allows the player to play some of the sharps. I am guessing that we tend to play in DAD more because we can play a F# and a C# without the extra frets.
